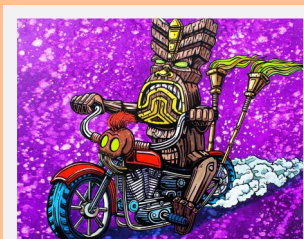

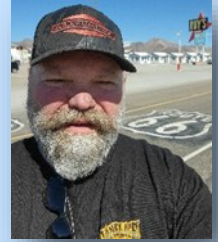

Warm Weather Riding



Hello Biggs HOG Members. It's been an eventful year so far and, unfortunately, we've had a few rain-outs. As we progress into summer, the rain-outs will be gone, but the temperatures will begin to rise. We had one ride recently where the temperature reached 105 degrees on the ride. Fortunately, that ride had a mid-point stop, as it was a Get Acquainted Ride, so all had an opportunity to **hydrate**, especially those without drink holders on their bikes or the ability to **hydrate** while riding.

Hydrating is critical for safe riding because if you get dehydrated, it mimics the conditions of being under the influence and your ability to ride safely is greatly diminished. While you may choose not to **hydrate**, the effects of not **hydrating** WILL affect you and the rest of the group. All riders need to understand that while riding in a group, they are not only responsible for their own safety but that of the other riders in the group as well. It is called *Group Cognizance*. What you do, or choose not to do (**hydrating**), WILL impact the group at some point.

Most of us ride 2-wheelers. If you get to the point of extreme dehydration, you may lose the ability to keep the bike upright and if you go down in the group, chances are you may cause other bikes to go down with you. I don't know about you, but I would be devastated if I caused other bikes to go down because I chose not to **hydrate**.

If the ride does not have a scheduled stop prior to the destination, and it is extremely hot, the Ride Leader most likely will find a place to stop and allow riders to **hydrate**. I did this last year when we departed on a ride and the temperature at the start of the ride, at Starbucks, was 103 at 10 am, and we were heading east. I saw that a couple of riders did not have a drink holder or any means to **hydrate** along the route. I knew we were going to pass a gas station along the route, so I pulled the group over at the gas station for the sole purpose of making sure all riders **hydrated**.

It's important to point out that you should rotate between drinking water and drinks with electrolytes. Electrolytes are crucial for body processes like conducting nerve impulses, contracting muscles, hydrating, and regulating pH levels. You need adequate electrolytes from your diet to keep your body healthy so you can ride safely.

Bottom Line – Hydrate Often!!

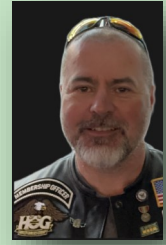

Safety

Group Riding Practices



Greetings, Biggs HOG family! The heart of the riding season is upon us. Let's take a moment to talk about safety and a few things I notice when I ride in a group; whether it be our group or even a group like the 16-bike group I led during the May Ride Poker Run last month.

The Basics: Safe Following Distances

A safe following distance gives you enough time to react, slow down, or stop safely. Typically, the recommended following distance at moderate speeds is at least two seconds behind the motorcycle in front of you and one second to the bike diagonal to you in stagger formation. To gauge this, pick a stationary object ahead (a sign, pole, tree, or shadow on the road). When the motorcycle in front passes it, start counting "one-one thousand, two-one thousand." If you reach the object before you finish counting, you're too close.

Reaction Time: Age Matters

Reaction time slows naturally with age. Studies show that reaction times can begin to noticeably increase after age 50. On average:

- Riders under 40 typically have reaction times around 1.5 to 2 seconds.
- Riders between 40 and 60 often see reaction times lengthen slightly to around 2 to 2.5 seconds. Riders over 60 may experience reaction times that exceed 2.5 seconds.

Knowing and accepting this reality means adjusting your following distance accordingly. If you're over 50, it's wise to add an extra second or two to your following distance.

Beware of Rubber-Banding and Drifting

"Rubber-banding" occurs when gaps in the group repeatedly close and open as riders accelerate to catch up, then brake when the group slows again. This pattern is tiring, reduces reaction time, and can lead to dangerous situations. Similarly, drifting - when riders unintentionally vary their speed - makes it difficult to maintain safe spacing.

How to Prevent Rubber-Banding

- *Maintain Consistent Speed:* Avoid unnecessary speed adjustments. Keep a steady throttle hand. Make small incremental adjustments with braking and throttle.
- *Look Further Ahead:* Anticipate slow-downs by watching traffic well ahead of your immediate riding partners. Slow down gradually instead of racing to the stop and braking hard.
- *Communicate Clearly:* Use clear hand signals with your left hand/arm when slowing down or stopping. For the most part, we under-communicate more times than not.
- *Know Your Limits:* If you're uncomfortable with the group speed, ask yourself why, or identify what is making you uncomfortable, and make corrections to eliminate that factor. Many times, the power is in your hands, literally! – especially your right hand (the throttle hand).

Remember, Safety Is No Accident!

Stay safe, have fun, and I'll see you all out on the road!

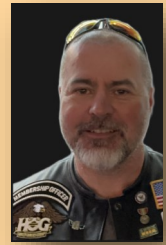

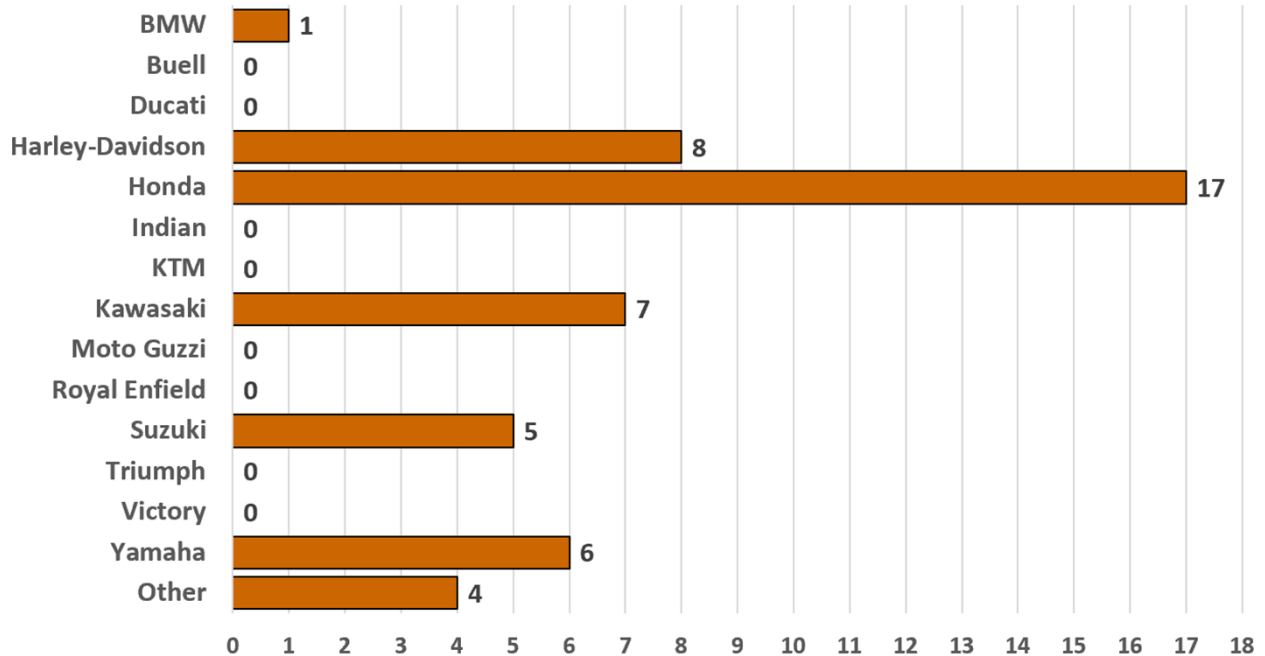
