Treasurer's Report

Sunset Chapter Treasurers Q2 Financial Report

Our bank accounts at the end of quarter two are about even compared to the 1st quarters balance. Though we should actually be down by 2K, but we were able to recover our PayPal account and found the we had a balance of roughly \$2,200 when we had thought that we only had around \$200 balance in the PayPal account.

These funds were from 2016 so they will not impact our 2017 taxes. We transferred \$2,000 of the PayPal funds into our checking account and this caused our bank accounts balances to increase by 2K with an overall asset increase of 2.2K. Because the 2.2K was added into our accounting as a 2018 beginning balance this did not increase income for the year.

Over all we are still at a negative income balance of \$4,240 for the year. The second quarter had a profit of \$348. Our Chapter is still in good shape due to a starting bank balance for the 2018 fiscal year of \$8,834 and this was not including the 2.2K that we did not know existed. This actually left the Chapter with about 11K of available cash at the end of 2017. During our next Business meeting I will be working with the all the officers to adjust our budget as needed to make sure we stay at a zero or small negative income for the year to keep our taxes at zero for next year.

Our Tax liability for 2017 was \$1,225 as compared to 2016 it was \$355. This is increase of \$870. The main reason for the increase is due to reevaluating our Chapter's merchandise inventory as an asset that in previous years had been written off as an expense. So, in other words we payed previous years taxes to get caught up this year. We are now in good shape for the future and now have process in place to only claim inventory as an ex-

pense (Cost of Goods Sold) when we sell the merchandise.

I am still working on getting our Chapter back to a 503(c)(7) not-for-profit status for this year so that going forward we will not have to pay taxes if we actually end up with a profit for the year. Part of getting and maintaining the 503(c)(7) status is the we don't have any income that is not related to our membership fees income that exceeds 35% of our membership income. We will have at least a \$850 application fee to get this not-for-profit status and we may have to also afford some legal expenses to make sure the application is completed correctly and the we meet the IRS requirements before applying. After updating our budget and we find that we need to make cuts, this might push out the chapter getting the not-for-profit status this year, but if we end up with a loss or break even, then we will not pay taxes next year.

During our next Chapter meeting, I am not planning any presentation on the numbers below, but I will make an announcement that I will have more detail information for those individuals that are interested.

Hope you all are having a great riding season so far. I know I am.

My Guardian Bell

There I was, Memorial Day 2018 in Spokane, Washington wrapping up a HOG group ride I was invited to by the Lone Wolf Chapter. We were sitting in a truck stop diner just outside of town eatina lunch. I was sitting with some old friends and some of the people I had met that day and we were talking about motorcycles,

rides and other biker stuff when Guardian Bells came up. One of the guys mentioned that he had just bought a brand new 2018 Road Glide CVO and had yet to put one on his bike. He assured me that his buddy was going to give him one in a month or so but was planning on a long ride before he met up with his buddy. The talk shifted to their next chapter rides and I dug into my pocket and pulled my bike keys out.

Every time you buy a motorcycle and announce it at the meeting, you are given a small guardian bell. It is brass. Etched with some basic symbols and it is not very big. It is very symbolic of the Legend of the Bell. I like legends and I like traditions, but never really put much faith in them being practical. When I bought my first Harley Davidson (a 1995 Fat Boy) I don't even know if it had a bell. I had heard of them but no one ever gave me one. Bob Driscoll gave me my first bell ever when I bought my Road King and joined this chapter. I thought it was a nice thing and traditional and for lack of anything better to do with it at the time, I put it on my key chain. I left it there. I bought another bike, a 2008 Electra Glide Ultra Classic and received another bell. I stayed with my personal tradition and attached it to the keychain. Now, my Road King and my Ultra BOTH have bells on them that someone gave me that I attached to

low points. That is 2 bells per bike because you can't be too safe from gremlins on a motorcycle, or so the interesting legend goes if you believe in such a thing.

So I was eating and listening to Lone Wolf Chapter talk about their next ride and pulled my bell off of my keychain and handed it to the guy. He declined it, but I insisted. I said an unprotected bike is prone to get into all kinds of trouble. He took it and thanked me. I could tell that he didn't really believe in the Legend of the Bell much either and was just being polite.

Within HOURS of that simple, traditional gesture, I developed an engine code on my Ultra and lost my Cruise Control. Uh oh. I rode around and got the code to go off but my gas mileage decreased by almost half. No idea what the hell was wrong. I limped home wondering if I should have given that guy the extra bell and made it back to Paradise Harley Davidson where I brought the bike to service and they looked and found nothing really wrong anywhere. F@(&!*% gremlins.

Later on I received a call from my friend up in Spokane who told me that the guy I gave my bell too was riding home and a truck in front of him had a box and some other stuff blow out of the bed and he narrowly missed wrecking. He said he had the wall to his left and a semi to his right and somehow made it through the minefield of boxes unscathed.



Safety First... Safety Last...

Riding in the rain

Riding in the best of conditions requires all of our attention to our bike, the road and all the drivers around us. Add weather conditions to the mix and there are many things we should "alert up" to so that we can avoid trouble or an accident. Rainy conditions effect our visibility, our being visible to other drivers, as well as create potential traction issues on roads that we could otherwise navigate when dry. It is better to avoid riding in the rain, but we can't always ride in sunny conditions.

Be more Visible or take a breather

We know how hard it is to ride and be seen when it is a nice sunny day. Add overcast, cloudy, misty or a down pour, and we become even harder to see riding down the road. While we should always be prepared by gearing up with the proper riding gear, we need to make sure that our reflective gear can be seen in other than night time conditions.

Understand the change in road conditions

Dry roads contain hazards, most of which we are able to see and react to in time to avoid issues or damage to our bike. Wet roads take some of those same conditions and make them even more hazardous. For example, rain brings out the oils and other crud that builds up on dry roads, which make the pavement slick and traction an issue, especially at the beginning of a rain storm. Realize that our normal breaking distance increases and plan accordingly.

Water on the roadway can cause hydroplaning or sliding and is made worse due to gravel or other debris on the road. That puddle in the road that looks like a mere splash can be a pothole in disguise. Don't fall for it. Many a rider has challenged the puddle only to have to replace a wheel and a tire.

Riding in a thunderstorm or hail is never a good idea. Find the nearest sheltered spot and stop until the

weather passes. Hydrate and rest until it is safe to get back on the road.

Be Prepared

We may start out the day in fine weather and optimal road conditions only to find that a rain storm shows up out of nowhere. Be prepared with proper rain gear in the saddle bags. Depending on the trip we are taking, we may also want to pack additional coverage for ourselves and our bike if we are caught in a complete downpour, hail or other adverse conditions. One rider shared a story of being caught in a hail storm. He stopped at the first opportunity. He had a tarp with

him, which he threw over his bike and himself to protect both from the beating of ping pong ball sized hail. We may not think we will have a need for these types of precautionary extras, but if we do need them, it's nice to have them along.

Braking distance

When brakes are wet, they may not grab as quickly as we expect. Leave more time for braking and distance from traffic as much as possible.

Avoid manhole covers or tar snakes that may cause slides and want us to grab our brakes, which could increase our chances of dumping our bike. Apply brakes slowly and check them often to make sure they are clean from debris that will splash upwards as you ride.

Last, but not least

Bring dry clothing and extra socks. Even though we have the best of riding gear, we still might get wet in places the riding gear doesn't seal off. Riding in wet gear can be miserable, so pack a change of clothing. It's not only for your comfort, but for your health as well. Low body temperature can be dangerous and negatively affect your ability to act and react while riding.

Plan ahead, be prepared and stay safe out there.

Two of the riders that I have traveled with over the years men-

tioned last fall that we should do a bucket list ride of places that are not on our regular runs. These two people are members of a group that have done B.C., Yukon Territory, Alaska, and the Northwestern US. They have done California but due to the fires last year have suggested we not include this area for this trip. The above describes the daily plan, miles and Best Western locations.

The new HD Ride Planner is a vast improvement over the original program. Google maps was the planner of choice in prior rides as their software showed real life pictures of roads and locations. The new HD Planner allows the use of Google maps along with the route planner, and you can tap on an icon to display all of the features of a destination. It is help-

ful in highlighting gas stops, motels, restaurants and points of interest. Building the route shows the preferred roads that are easily moved to roads of choice. All in all, I can build a route in less than ½ the time that I used to spend with the old format. The GPX file is compatible with all GPS systems in the US, not sure about the European systems. We are off on Tuesday after Memorial Day and I hope to see you on the road. Daily accounts will be sent to Sherrie X for posting to the Swine line.

Our first day took us to Benton City, WA; to pick up the first checkpoint and meet my friend Dean coming down from Lake Sammamish, WA. We then head south on freeway all the way to North Powder on I 84 be-

tween La Grande and Baker City. The North Powder Café provided a good lunch stop then south to Nampa, ID. The Best Western at Civic Center is a new property with a good restaurant on the property. Clean up rags were provided and we were down for the night. 500 mile day, good weather and a high speed run on the interstates. A note: I am traveling with a BMW GTL 1600B and a BMW

RT1200GT, both fast bikes that had my HDFLHT-KSE running hard to keep pace. We use the Senna helmet to helmet intercom to communicate and it cut our battery life in half plus the lack of a VOX control gave us an open mike for most of the trip. This creates a lot of problems in the Harley system as it will shut all of the features of the infotainment system down. The BMW system had no problems.. Idaho has an 80MPH limit on the interstate, easy for the BMW's and a stretch for the Harley. The 117ci 4 valve is a smooth runner but no match for the BMW's; I do run well in the turns and only my experience let me keep ahead. It is all about the ride so the nickel and dime stuff doesn't matter.

Cedar Creek Grist Mill ride and Four Rivers, plus Lilac Festival ride



We took a leisurely jaunt through the country to the <u>Cedar Creek Grist Mill</u> outside of Woodland, WA. The Cedar Creek Grist Mill is a historical, waterpowered, grain-grinding mill. Volunteers provided demonstrations and bags of fresh-milled flour and cornmeal.

We started at Paradise Harley-Davidson and meandered out of Tigard and headed North on I-205 to connect with Highway 14 East and went up over Cape Horn. We turned up the Salmon Creek Highway and from there meandered through the foothills of Skama-

nia County and Clark County. We crossed the Washougal River and

followed it almost to the Columbia River. We turned off and travelled through some more of the foothills to connect with the Lewis River. We then worked our way over through Amboy and Yacolt and down into Woodland Cedar Creek just outside of Woodland, Washington. After we had our lunch, we toured the happenings at the Gristmill, which was a step back in time where we learned how flour and cornmeal is made from water power. After the tour we proceeded into Woodland and toured the Lilac Festival in the Lilac Gardens.

We headed back in towards Vancouver and Portland on I-5 and split off as everyone went to find their own home destinations. The mileage of this ride was approximately 75 miles, but pretty close to a 6-hour riding day with the tours included. We all rode safe and had fun!







Stonehenge Ride

Who hasn't heard of the ancient, Stonehenge located the county of Wiltshire, high on Salisbury Plain in England? It is made up of huge stones, broken and fallen from age and has caught our



attention for centuries. But how do we ride to England to see this awesome site? Well, we don't! We can see it here near Maryhill, Washington, three miles east of Maryhill Museum of Art where stands a full-scale replica of Stonehenge.

We set off on our ride up through Mt. Hood National Forest on Highway 26 with a gas stop at Government

Camp. From there we headed up on Highway 219 with a lunch stop at Maupin then rode up and joined Highway 97 to a brief stop at Biggs Junction. From Biggs Junction we rode up to Stonehenge for a rest stop. From Stonehenge we followed Washington SR14 to Bonneville for another gas stop and then on SR14 to I-205 and back to Paradise. We covered about 295 miles in a 6-hour ride. This is one of the best rides of the year.





Antique Powerland Ride



We left PHD at 9:30am with a group of

people to head to Powerland Heritage Park just North of Salem on a nice blending of urban, farm, twisty and highway roads for what ended up being about an 80 mile ride. There were roads that many had never been on before and it was a great ride.

It was nice to see people riding with us who were not chapter members and I hope they come out and ride again. There was a scheduled stop to accommodate Peanut Tanks and a stretch at the Pilot Truck Stop in Donald. We skirted Newberg and other towns that were prone to have traffic snarls on the way to the stop.

When we got to Powerland Heritage Park, we walked past a replica 1930's Texaco Service Station and we toured the Northwest Vintage Car & Motorcycle Museum. The museum staff was very generous and gave us a tour highlighting various antique cars and motorcycles they have on display, some are very rare and in beautiful condition. We saw what is believed to be the oldest non restored school bus on record

and there were a couple of bus drivers on the ride who got a kick out of that. There were some very nice vehicles on display, some of them were the cutting edge of technology of the time (hand cranked hidden headlights anyone??)

The unique thing about the Vintage Car Motorcycle Museum is they give to the community. They are not just a museum that collects relics and charges admission to look at them. They are active in restorations and preserving the automobile. They have a program where they work with at risk teens. I copied this from their website:

"The Northwest Vintage Car & Motorcycle Museum works with local schools to teach auto-

motive skills to high school students at Powerland Heritage Park. The Museum provides the facility and mentors who teach automotive mechanics, metal fabricating, woodworking, spray painting, automotive electrical, metal casting and foundry work, upholstery, safety, teamwork and car show etiquette. Since the program be-



gan, we have had over 350 students participate in the Speedster program. Several our Speedster students have gone on to Chemeketa Community College's automotive program."

The 19th annual Hells Canyon Motorcycle Rally in Baker City, Oregon is fast approaching. It will be July 12-16, 2018 and covers about a thousand miles of riding. Online Registration ends July 2nd and only costs \$50 bucks. It includes a book detailing rides, ride pin stops, a free breakfast at the Baker Truck Corral, free admission to the Kickstart Party at the VFW, a campsite, admission to flat track races, a T-Shirt and vest pin.

Each ride has a scenic place that you can take a selfie of you there and earn up to ten pins (there are a couple rides I did not list as

they are gravel/dirt and geared toward adventure riders). It is totally self paced and doubtful you will see it all in 3 ½ days.

The original organizer of the event is pulling out for reasons of his own. Lucky for us, High Desert Harley Davidson from Meridian, Idaho will be continuing the rally and it will

come back around next year. The people of Baker City welcome all riders to their town and surrounding areas and count on this rally as a major cash infusion for the year. They really bend over backwards and open their high school football field up to tent camping and use of their locker room for restroom/shower facilities, as well as blocking off a pretty good portion of their town for motorcycle parking. There will be a shuttle provided between the festivities and the camp site so no one will feel compelled to party too hard and try to ride.

We will meet at Paradise Harley Davidson at 10:30 am and leave at 11:00am. We will take Hwy 217 to 15 to 20f and get off at Johnson City and take Hwy 212 through Damascus. We will get on Hwy 26 through Sandy and ride through Government Camp then get on Hwy 35 and follow it to Hood River. We will ride I-84 the rest of the way to Baker City. Stops are planned in

Govt Camp, The Dalles, Arlington, Pendleton and on to Baker City. Additional stops between Pendleton and Baker city can be made if needed.

The Rides

Alpine Course (Gunsite Mountain) is 112 miles long. This is a mountain twisty ride to Sumpter, which is rich in mining history. It continues to Granite for aas and convenience then North Powder into Haines where you can have a meal stop at a World famous steakhouse before returning to Baker City.

> Canyon ride (Route 666/Devil's Tail) is 91 miles long and goes to Hells Canyon Dam. Richland is a typical stop and then on to Halfway where there are food and gas available. Scotty's chance before getting into the canyon for 22 miles of pea grinding fun in Idaho.

Gas Stop is the last gas

Forest Course (Tamarack Trail/Gold Rush/ Ghost Town) 209 miles long winding through a cooling forest (tied for coldest spot in Oregon once) between Granite and Ukiah. It goes to La Grande and options are available for the return to Baker City on the freeway or a more slightly Hwy 30 to Medical Springs.

Gateway Course (Route 666/The Ogre) 208 mile ride through Richland and Halfway (meal and gas stops). This course is the gateway to Hells Canyon and crosses into Idaho and eventually to the last stop on the Oregon Trail near Huntington.

Lucky Dragon (Lucky Hwy 7/The Little Dragon) 120 miles of twisty ride dreams come true covering 188 corners in 14 miles. This ride climbs Dooley Mountain with an elevation of 5,420 ft., 700 feet under the summit elevation! The road continues and drops into the Burnt River Canyon that has wide views and sweeping curves. Rolling

the speed no matter how tempting it is. There is fuel in Unity and you ride back up the Burnt River Valley and on The Little Dragon from the opposite side.

through Unity (gas & food) to a biker friendly joint in Austin Junction for another opportunity for food and meeting friendly owners. It continues on following the Powder River to Phillips Lake and mason Dam.

Mountain Course (Road Rash Pass) 250 miles covering ALL of the Hells Canyon scenic byway. Breakfast stop in Richland and on to Road Rash Pass. This road has had recent construction and is a good one, but has no center lines or guardrails, cell service or help. It DOES have the Hells Canyon Overlook so you can see Hells Canyon and the Seven Devils Mountains. Heading to Joseph for fuel, you can see the "American Alps" and have the option of riding to

Wallowa Lake and riding a tram to a vantage point to see the whole lake. The ride heads to La Grande and back to Baker City.

Owyhee Course (Owyhee

Dam) 262 Miles of riding while viewing Union Pacific Trains going about their business. Food is available in Ontario. Owyhee is a gas pump and store and the ride to the lake is beautiful. There is a tunnel on the route to the dam. Owyhee Dam is one of the most architecturally significant dams in the NW. Backtracking and going between Vale and Unity the OSP tend to work so watch
