


STAYING SAFE IN FORMATION

ISN'T THIS LOVELY COUNTRY?

Have you ever heard of Lovely county??

Chances are where you live now was part of Lovely county. This is a part of Arkansas history before statehood.

William Lovely was an agent to early Arkansas who purchased property from the Osage to benefit the Cherokees. He apparently intended the government to reimburse him for his land purchase. However, he died before he completed the deal. At the time he was well over 60 years of age and he left his young widow, Persis, with the land he had purchased. This purchase became the basis for Lovely County, an Arkansas county that lasted only 6 months.


Lovely County spread from Catoosa, OK to Springdale, Arkansas and overlapped other grants, including the Cherokee grants. The Cherokees objected to Lovely County, and the original purchase was vacated of whites by the government, "excepting the widow of William Lovely." One text reports that "William and Peter Lovely came...", but it may be that the original text actually read "William and Persis", as she clearly was with him during this time and there is otherwise no confirmation that a relative came with him.

Major Lovely came to an area near Russellville, and in an early account, he complained to the government that white outlaws were robbing settlers of their possessions and he requested that an Army outpost be built nearby to establish law and order. After acquiring the land grant, he died on the return trip to Washington, D. C.

With the Cherokee boundary unsettled, Lovely County came into being at almost the same time the area was being surveyed. Upon approval of the survey line between Fort Smith and Joplin, MO, the present Oklahoma - Arkansas border was created. Lovely County thus included parts of Oklahoma. Within months after its inception, Lovely County was no more and its records were to be entrusted to the Sheriff of Washington County.

Nevertheless, papers were found during the 1960's in a Watts, Oklahoma trash bin that turned out to be some original records from Lovely County. The originals were given to the Gilcrease Museum in Tulsa and copies to the University of Arkansas Special Collections.
